



COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

PYSL WILL FOLLOW STATE AND COUNTY GUIDELINES REGARDING COVID-19

Safety Protocols

- Face coverings shall be worn as players travel from their personal vehicles onto the soccer field, and at all times when not participating in trainings and games.
- Face coverings are not required for players while participating in the trainings and games.
- Face coverings shall be worn by coaches, and spectators at all times. Refusal of spectators to abide by these protocols may result in their ejection from the sidelines and playing fields at the discretion of PYSL coaches and officials.
- Players shall not share drink bottles or other personal items and equipment.
- Observers shall maintain at least 6 feet from non-household members.
- Mixing with other households prior to and post any practice or competition must strictly adhere to current gathering guidance.
- No players or coaches shall participate in trainings or games if exhibiting any symptoms of Covid-19 including: fever or chills; cough; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; sore throat; nausea or vomiting.
- No players or coaches shall participate in trainings or games for 10 days after they have come in close contact with another individual who has tested positive for Covid-19 unless that player or coach is vaccinated and is not demonstrating symptoms of Covid-19.

Protocol for A Positive Test:

If a player tests positive for Covid-19, the player's parents shall immediately contact the player's coach. The coach shall notify their division director and the player's team of any possible exposure while respecting the medical privacy of the player in question. The team shall not participate in trainings or games for a period of 10 days from the date of possible exposure.

If a coach tests positive for Covid-19, the coach shall notify their division director and each team that they coach of any possible exposure. The coach and any exposed teams shall not participate in trainings or games for a period of 10 days from the date of possible exposure.

PYSL will make every effort to reschedule games which are cancelled due to the above protocol, time and field space permitting.

In the event of a positive test with possible exposure to a different team, (ie: game played during contagious period) the division director shall notify the other team of the possible exposure. This team will not be required to abstain from trainings or games absent a positive test from their own roster.
